## The Easter Season, by Pastor Tom Bellhy

The snow has melted away and we have come out of a long snowy winter ready to enter Springtime and the promise of new life. There is revival in the earth as once dormant, dead seeds rise up to bloom into new creations so different from their dismal dreary state of winter's deathlike grip.

In this same way our lives, as believers in Jesus Christ, reflect the grip of death that once held us as we move onto a new life in Christ. Romans 6:4 tells us that, *"We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."*

The old, dead life of disobedience toward God has broken

way to a new life of eternal relationship. We have been reconciled once again to the Father. The Easter message of death to sin and renewal of life by the saving work of Jesus on the cross and His glorious resurrection is at work in us. Our fallen human nature of defiance toward God has been put to death and we have been resurrected to new life in Christ.

The service is April 1 at 7:00pm. An intimate candlelight service remembering Jesus last supper with His disciples. We will read His Word and participate in the Lord's Supper.

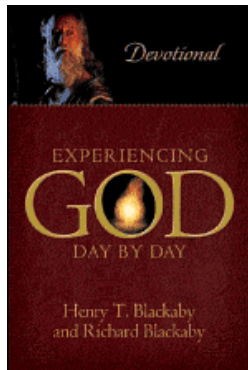
**Good Friday Service:**

## Monthly Devotional

*His head and hair were white like wool, as white as snow, and His eyes like a flame of fire; His feet were like fine brass, as if refined in a furnace, and His voice as the sound of many waters.*

(Revelation 1:14-15)

At times it is tempting to conclude: "If only I could have walked with Jesus, as the twelve disciples did, it would be so much easier to live the Christian life!" This thought reveals that we do not comprehend the greatness of the risen Christ we serve today. The Jesus of the Gospels is often portrayed as One who walked along the seashore, loving children and gently forgiving sin-

ners. Yet the image of Jesus that we see at the close of the New Testament is far more dramatic! He stands in awesome power as He rules all creation. His appearance is so magnificent that when John, His beloved disciple, sees Him, he falls to the ground as though he were dead (Rev. 1:17).

We grossly underestimate the God we serve! To ignore God's word or to disobey a direct command from Him is to ignore the magnificent nature of Christ. Our fear of other people proves that we do not understand the awesome Lord who walks with us. The Christ

we serve today is the Lord of all creation. He is vastly more awesome and powerful than the gentle rabbi we often imagine.

If you struggle with your obedience to Christ, take a closer look at how He is portrayed in the Book of Revelation. If you are succumbing to temptation, call upon the powerful One who dwells in you. If you have forgotten how great and mighty the Lord is, meet Him through the vision of the beloved disciple. The encounter will dramatically affect the way you live!

## Why is Easter on a Different Date Every Year?

The Christian festival of Easter celebrates Jesus' resurrection. The name 'Easter' derives from the Anglo-Saxon goddess of Spring (Eostre or Ostara), but the Christian festival developed from the Jewish Passover, because according to the Gospels the events of Jesus' last days took place at the time of Passover. Easter was originally observed on the day following the end of the Passover fast (14 Nisan), regardless of the day of the week on which it fell. In the mid-second century, however, some Gentile Christians began to celebrate it on the Sunday after 14 Nisan, with the preceding Friday observed as the day of Christ's crucifixion, regardless of the date on which it fell. The resulting controversy over the correct time for observing the Easter festival reached a head in A.D. 197,

when Victor of Rome excommunicated those Christians who insisted on celebrating Easter on 14 Nisan. The dispute continued until the early fourth century, when the Quarto-decimans (from Latin for '14') were required by Emperor Constantine to conform to the empire-wide practice of observing Easter on the Sunday following 14 Nisan, rather than on that date itself.

Easter is currently celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox on or after March 21—or one week later if the full moon falls on Sunday. In other words, Easter falls between March 22 and April 25. Easter falls differently for Orthodox Christianity which, unlike Western Christianity, did not accept the Gregorian calendar reform in 1582.

Originally a unitary feast celebrating the Exodus and the Christian redemption, Easter was split up in the fourth century into its component parts, Easter Day becoming a separate commemoration of Christ's resurrection. For a long time it was also the pre-eminent occasion for Christian initiation (baptism), understood as a participation in the paschal mystery.
